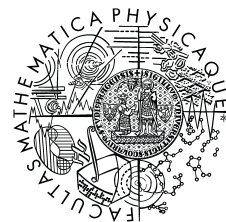

Conference Venue

The Jesuits built the House for the Professed during the 17th century on the main square of Prague Lesser Town. This was the seat of the Order after their first residence in the Old Town became too small for their activities.

A gem of Prague Baroque architecture, St Nicholas Church, was joined to the House in the 18th century by architects Kilián and Kryštof Dienzenhofer, leading personalities of the Czech Baroque style.

After the suppression of the Jesuit Order in 1773, the House for the Professed became property of the Habsburg Monarchy, who located their Provincial Court there. After establishing the Czechoslovak Republic in 1918, the basement of the building was used to house the golden treasure of the new state. During World War II, the house was used by the German army.

Later on, its rooms passed on to the University and the Faculty of Mathematics and Physics now resides there. In 2006 a costly renovation was completed and now the refectory is once again adorned with splendid wall and ceiling frescoes.
